

1 A. Mr. Corcoran became the junior high principal.

2 Q. Who is the superintendent of the school
3 district?

4 A. John Bailey.

5 Q. Have you seen Mr. Harris, Mr. Bailey and Mr.
6 Corcoran at the courthouse?

7 A. I haven't seen them here, no, sir.

8 Q. Have you seen Doug Ogletree here?

9 A. Yes, sir, I saw him this morning.

10 Q. Now, Doug Ogletree is still a teacher at Glen
11 Rose School District; is that correct?

12 A. Yes, sir.

13 Q. Are you aware that even after these allegations
14 some of these boys were students in his class?

15 A. Yes, sir.

16 Q. The school district didn't see fit to change
17 those boys' class schedules to remove them from --

18 MS. LAMB: Judge, I would object. She
19 can't give testimony as to the motivations of the school
20 district. She's just a counselor.

21 MR. BEASLEY: I didn't ask about the
22 motivations, Judge. I just asked --

23 THE COURT: I'm going to sustain the
24 objection as to the way the question was phrased.

25 Q. (By Mr. Beasley) You're familiar with students'

1 class schedules?

2 A. Yes.

3 Q. You testified on Direct that you assist them in
4 making these class changes?

5 A. Yes, sir.

6 Q. The school district didn't make a change. In
7 other words, they didn't take Mr. Ogletree and put him
8 somewhere else?

9 A. No, sir.

10 Q. They let him teach the class?

11 A. Yes, sir.

12 Q. And they let him teach some of these boys?

13 A. Yes, sir.

14 Q. And the boys chose to continue with Mr. Ogletree
15 as their teacher?

16 A. Yes, sir. Some of the courses that they took,
17 they had to take. Mr. Ogletree is the only one that
18 teaches physics -- or taught physics that last year. And
19 they needed it to graduate, so they took it. They
20 could've taken another course, so I guess they did choose
21 it.

22 Q. Yes, they did choose it, didn't they?

23 A. Yes.
